Automated reach. Human verification. Court-level accuracy.

The California Supersearch (CASS) searches California Superior Courts across 39 counties simultaneously, covering more than 96% of the state's population. Potential records are verified by expert researchers and returned in one consolidated, FCRA-compliant report. No private databases used. No separate county follow-up orders needed.



Parallel Searches

Superior Courts searched in parallel across 39 counties for broad coverage.



Automation + Expert Review

Automated case retrieval, followed by researcher verification on every hit for IDs, accuracy, and reportability.



Court-Level Confirmation

Confirmed records include case number, court, charge level, dates, disposition, sentencing, and readily available identifiers.

No private databases.

TYPICAL SCOPE

10 years: felony/misdemeanor convictions
7 years by file date: non-convictions

No private databases. No county follow-up searches required.
